

A SENATE BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate the sum of Three Million Four Hundred Forty Two Thousand Four Hundred Six Dollars (\$3,442,406.00) or so much thereof to the Disaster Relief Fund for the purpose of addressing the initial urgent humanitarian needs of the people of Chuuk State especially those severely affected by the tropical storm Sinlaku which cause severe destruction to the properties and livelihood of our people, and for other purposes.

**Be it enacted by the Chuuk State Legislature:**

1           Section 1. Appropriation. The sum of Three Million Four Hundred Forty Two Thousand Four  
2 Hundred Six Dollars (\$3,442,406.00) or so much thereof is hereby authorized and appropriated to the  
3 Disaster Relief Fund which will be sourced from the available local revenue fund for the purpose of  
4 addressing the initial urgent humanitarian needs of the people of Chuuk State especially those severely  
5 affected by the tropical storm Sinlaku which cause severe destruction to the properties and livelihood  
6 of our people.

7           Section 2. Restrictions and Limitations. The Task Force created pursuant to the Emergency  
8 Declaration shall solely expend any and all amounts appropriated herein in accordance with this Act,  
9 the Financial Management Act of the State, and its implementing rules and regulations and other  
10 relevant laws. These funds shall remain available until fully expended. The Governor shall be the  
11 allottee of this fund and all payments under this Act shall be recommended by the Disaster Relief Task  
12 Force as endorsed by the Governor.

13           Section 3. Report. The Director of Administrative Services of Chuuk State Government and the  
14 Disaster Relief Taskforce shall file and submit reports to the Governor and the Chuuk State Legislature  
15 within 30 days after the full expenditure is made.

16           Section 4. Effective Date. This Act shall take effect upon approval by the Governor, or upon its  
17 becoming law without such approval.



## Executive Summary

The State of Chuuk, part of the Federated States of Micronesia, is geographically dispersed across numerous lagoon islands and remote outer atolls, making it highly vulnerable to tropical storms, typhoons, and sea-level rise. The state has a population of approximately 34,000 people, with a significant youth demographic and a GDP heavily reliant on subsistence agriculture, fishing, and US federal assistance under the Compact of Free Association.

Tropical Storm Sinlaku formed near Pohnpei and Chuuk on April 8th, 2026. By April 9th, it had upgraded to a Tropical Depression, intensifying throughout the day with very strong winds and slow movement. As of April 10th, a Tropical Storm Warning remains in effect for Chuuk Lagoon Islands, Fananu, Ulul, and Pollowat. The storm's current location is 8.5°N, 151.5°E, with maximum sustained winds of 70 mph moving east at 1 mph. Early mitigative measures included public announcements and the activation of the Chuuk Disaster and Emergency Operation Center (CDEOC) on April 9th.

This action plan addresses the immediate and short-term needs following the impact of Tropical Storm Sinlaku. The projected recovery period to restore the state to pre-disaster levels is 12 months. The plan outlines a multi-sectoral response focusing on Shelter and Protection, Health & Water, Food Security & Agriculture, Infrastructure, and Logistics for the affected islands.

## Context and Humanitarian Consequences

Tropical Storm Sinlaku has caused widespread damage across Chuuk State. The main capital island of Weno experienced strong winds, a storm surge, and sea water intrusion. Large fallen trees have blocked main roads leading to Nantaku. Boats were displaced from their anchorages.

In the Northwest Islands, communities experienced severe conditions including strong winds, storm surge, fallen trees, roofs blown off homes, and significant sea water intrusion. As a result, many families have been displaced into evacuation shelters across five main regions: Northern Nomoneas, Southern Nomoneas, Faichuuk, Northwest, and Mortlocks.

### Projected and Secondary Consequences:

**Health:** Risk of waterborne diseases due to saltwater intrusion contaminating freshwater sources.

**Education:** Schools are being used as evacuation shelters, leading to the suspension of classes, disrupting instructions, and staff leaving regular scheduled work to attend to Emergency Assessments.

**Economic Impact:** Business, Trade, and Tourism Services are being affected. Damage to boats, coral reefs, and crops will severely impact local food supply and income, increasing reliance on external aid.

**Protection:** Displaced families, including children and the elderly, in crowded shelters are at increased risk.

## Response to Date

April 9th, 2026: The CDEOC issued the first public announcement on V6 AK Radio.

April 10th, 2026:

- The Advisory was upgraded. A Typhoon Warning was issued for Weito (Makkur, Ono, Onou, Piherarh, Onoun) and Paffong (Murilo, Ruo, Nomwin, Fananu).
- Situation (Sitrep) Report 1 & 2 was issued.
- The Governor was recommended to activate the Command Post.
- Shelters began to open on Weno (Chuuk High School, V6 AK Building, Wichap Kalili Church, Neauo CCHS Clinic) and in the outer islands.
- Communities began evacuating to shelters.
- Response expenses to date (assessment & deployment) are estimated at \$25,000 and are included in the Admin budget line.

- Governor issued an Emergency Declaration for Chuuk State and Submit their request of assistance to the National Government.

## **Needs by Sector**

### **A. Shelter and Protection**

Many families have been displaced into shelters. The immediate need is for essential non-food items and dignity kits. The displaced population is located in:

1. Weno: Chuuk High School, V6 AK Building, Wichap Kalili Church, Neauo CCHS Clinic, Seven-days school, Saram High School,
2. Northwest Region (13 Islands)
3. Southern Namoneas Region (5 Islands)
4. Faichuuk Regions (8 Islands)
5. Fonoton and Piispaneu Islands

### **B. Health & Water**

**Water:** Provision of clean drinking water to 34,000 individuals (based on planned distribution of 714,000 cases). This is equivalent to 249,900 liters to sustain them for 7 days.

**Health:** Emergency medical supplies for shelters, hygiene kits to prevent disease outbreaks, and public health surveillance for waterborne illnesses.

### **C. Food Security & Agriculture (For Marine Res. Protein)**

**Food Assistance:** Immediate provision of supplemental food, specifically 6,375 bags of 40lbs rice, to meet caloric needs while agriculture recovers. This is equivalent to 255K lbs of rice to sustain them for 7 days.

**Agriculture Support:** Provision of fast-growing, salt-tolerant crop seedlings and tools to restart home gardens and return to pre-disaster production levels.

### **D. Infrastructure**

**Roads:** Clearing of primary roads on Weno blocked by fallen trees.

**Buildings:** Repairs to roofs of private homes and public buildings (schools, clinics) used as shelters.

**Coastal Protection:** Assessment and repair of damaged sea walls and boat ramps.

**Utilities:** Repairs to pole and lines, sanitation destroyed.

## E. Logistics

Transportation: Sea, Land and air transport for assessment teams and relief supplies to the Northwest and Mortlock Islands (outer islands).

EOC Capacity: Increased logistical coordination capacity, including POL (Petrol, Oil, Lubricants) for assessment vessels.

Communications: Re-establishing communication links with outer islands and lagoon Islands. (considering usage of Starlink)

## Objectives and Activities Matrix

### Health and Water Objectives

1. Ensure all displaced individuals in shelters have access to safe drinking water.
2. Prevent waterborne and communicable disease outbreaks in affected communities.
3. Restore access to basic primary health services for all affected populations.

### Shelter and Protection Objectives

1. Provide immediate, safe, and dignified shelter for all displaced families.
2. Distribute essential non-food items (NFIs) and hygiene kits to affected households.
3. Ensure the protection of vulnerable individuals (children, elderly, disabled) within evacuation centers.

### Food Security and Agriculture Objectives

1. Provide emergency food rations to cover immediate caloric needs for 7-30 days.
2. Restore small-scale household food production through the distribution of agricultural inputs.
3. Assess and support the repair of damage to the fisheries sector (boats & gear).

### Infrastructure Objectives

1. Clear primary transportation routes on Weno to facilitate the movement of aid.
2. Conduct rapid assessments of damage to public infrastructure (roads, sea walls, schools).

3. Repair critical public buildings and Infrastructure (schools/clinics, power poles and lines) to functioning status.

**Logistics Objectives**

1. Establish a coordination mechanism for sea, land and air transport to all affected regions.
2. Deploy assessment and response teams to the Lagoon Islands, Northwest and Mortlock Islands.
3. Ensure the EOC has sufficient fuel and supplies for sustained response operations.
