
A SENATE BILL FOR AN ACT

To establish the entitlement for the Lieutenant Governor, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Chuuk State Legislature:

1 **Section 1. Short Title.** This Act may be cited as the “Lieutenant Governor’s
2 Entitlement Act of 2026”.

3 **Section 2. Findings.** The Legislature passed the State Official’s Salary and Expense
4 Allowance Act of 2024 by providing the salary, expense allowance and protocol of the
5 Governor. This left the Lieutenant Governor with no salary and other entitlement by virtue
6 of a law other than the annual fiscal year appropriations.

7 **Section 3. Purpose.** Ever since the passage of the Chuuk State Constitution and the
8 enactment of the entitlement of the Governor, the Office of the Lieutenant Governor has no
9 official entitlement except the salary pursuant to CSL 6-01-02 which was repealed by CSL
10 17-24-12. Hence, considering that the Lieutenant Governor conducts the same function as
11 that of the Governor, especially during the absence of the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor
12 should be entitled to some entitlement.

13 **Section 4. Definition.** As used in this Act, unless the context indicates otherwise: This
14 allowance is for the creation of network and partnerships for the institution and to cover any
15 expense that may or have been incurred while in the performance of duties, and the use of
16 this allowance must reflect the highest standards of conduct, taste, and economy, while
17 avoiding the appearance of any personal benefit.

18 (a) “Entitlements” means salary, expense allowance, representation fund, and the
19 provision of one official government vehicle for the use of the Lieutenant
20 Governor while in the office, as authorized by this Act.

21 (b) “Expense Allowance” means the allowance that the Lieutenant Governor shall
22 use to offset his actual expense incurred in the performance of his leadership role
23 while visiting the Chuukese communities as required under customary and
24 traditional obligations. Expense allowance does not include daily monetary

1 amount to offset personal or family expense and obligations, entitlements or
2 protocol fund.

3 (c) "Representation fund" in the Office of the Lieutenant Governor refers to a
4 discretionary budget used to cover official hospitality and protocol expenses—
5 such as hosting dignitaries, providing ceremonial gifts, or supporting events that
6 promote the office's public and diplomatic functions. It is not a personal
7 allowance but a regulated fund meant to uphold the dignity of the office and foster
8 government relations.

9 (d) "Salary" means a reward or recompense fixed periodically or paid biweekly,
10 monthly or yearly to the public officer for performance of official duties.

11 **Section 5. Entitlements.** For the purpose of this Act, the Lieutenant Governor of the
12 Chuuk State shall be entitled to the following:

16 **Section 6. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any person
17 or circumstance is found to be invalid, or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect
18 other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid
19 provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.

20 **Section 7. Effective Date.** This Act shall take effect upon approval of the Governor
21 or upon its becoming law without such approval.
